Documentaries

Secrets: The Sphinx
2013 – Netflix
Featuring Stefanie's Egyptology professor, Melinda Hartwig, this 45 min. documentary present several lines of evidence about who built the Sphinx and why.

Patterns of Evidence Exodus
2014 – Netflix
Featuring several of our colleagues, this documentary proposes a controversial theory about the Exodus and when it took place. Please note that we **do not** support the theory given here, but there are some interesting pieces of evidence that do hold some weight as well as presenting the various interpretations and theories that we as Biblical archaeologists deal with on a frequent basis concerning evidence about Biblical events.

The Square
2013 – Netflix
In *The Square*, named after Cairo's revolutionary Tahrir Square, director Jehane Noujaim follows half a dozen or so protesters – mostly bright, young, and secular – across a historically defining three year period. Audiences are transported to the very center of the action from the beginning; this is as close as it gets to witnessing the inner conflicts that moved the Egyptian Revolution to its latter phases. Unflinchingly documented, it captures unencumbered idealism, violence and betrayal.

Building Pharaoh's Chariot

Watch as a team of archaeologists, Egyptologists, engineers, woodworkers, and horse trainers join forces to build and test two highly accurate replicas of Egyptian royal chariots. A fascinating look at the astonishing engineering genius revealing that the Egyptian chariot created a crucial turning point in ancient military history.

Egypt (TV series)

A BBC docudrama serial portraying events in the history of Egyptology from the 18th through the early 20th centuries. The first two episodes explore the work of Howard Carter and his quest for King Tut's tomb. The next two episodes focus on the eccentric explorer "The Great Belzoni." The final two episodes dramatize the discovery and deciphering of the Rosetta Stone.

Petra - Lost City of Stone

Watch an archaeologist and sculptors as they team up to carve an iconic temple-tomb to find out how the ancient people of Petra built their city of stone. Meanwhile, scientists using remote sensors and hydraulic flumes uncover the vast city and its sophisticated water system.
